As we move into October with a busy Lodge/Masonic calendar, I wanted to take this opportunity to focus on one particular upcoming event this month. On Thursday, October 9 we will be hosting an Informational Open House open to anyone who wants to know more about Freemasonry. This event was promoted at the Lafayette Arts and Wine Festival and we also have a big banner on the side of our building advertising it. The reason for my attention to this one event (I will add some comments about other events at the end of this article) is that it reminds us that while we do not believe that our Lodge and Masonry is a secret, there is a lack of



awareness and understanding from the general public. Does this keep potential prospects from reaching out to find out more? I believe that it might, and also that this unawareness promulgates misconceptions and misunderstandings. 


